In the photo above, the artificial obstruction clearly interferes with the player's **swing**.

In the photo on the right, the obstruction is a cart path. The player gets relief because the obstruction interferes with the player's **stance**.

In the photo on the left, the obstruction is also a cart path. The player gets relief because the obstruction interferes with the player's **ball**.

Video: Nearest pt of relief

When an immovable obstruction (an artificial object) interferes with

- 1. your ball,
- 2. your stance, or
- 3. your swing, you may take *free relief*.



You may take relief from artificially surfaced roads and paths, including their artificial borders

Video: Path/road OB

Example of No Line-of-Site Relief

When the ball has come to rest behind an obstruction that cannot be moved, such as a maintenance shop inside the course, a pump house, storm shelter, light pole, or, here, a sprinkler box,

If the obstruction is between the ball and the hole, and it *does not* interfere with your ball, your stance, or your swing, there is no relief, commonly referred

to as line-of-site relief. There is **no** line-of-site relief in golf.
